Saint Ignatius of Loyola (23 October 1491 – 31 July 1556) was the youngest of 13 children of a family of minor nobility in northern Spain. As a young man Ignatius was inflamed by the ideals of courtly love and knighthood and dreamed of doing great things.

In 1521 Ignatius was seriously wounded in a battle with the French. While recuperating, he experienced a conversion. Reading the lives of Jesus and the saints made Ignatius happy and he desired to do great things. St. Ignatius had always dreamed of imitating heroic deeds, but now, the heroes had names like Francis of Assisi and Catherine of Siena. Ignatius also noticed something strange happening to him, God, he realized, was working within him. Ignatius realized that these feelings were clues to God's direction for him. As he traveled far and wide these experiences would prove to be the beginnings of Ignatian spirituality — and Jesuit ministry.

He became a Spanish Basque Catholic priest and theologian, who co-founded the religious order called the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) and became its first Superior General at Paris in 1541. The Jesuit order served the Pope as missionaries, and they were bound by a vow of special obedience to the sovereign pontiff in regard to the missions. They therefore emerged as an important force during the time of the Counter-Reformation.

Ignatius is remembered as a talented spiritual director. He recorded his method in a celebrated treatise called the Spiritual Exercises, a simple set of meditations, prayers, and other mental exercises, first published in 1548.

Ignatius died in Rome on 31 July 1556, as a result of the Roman Fever, a severe case of malaria that recurred in Rome, Italy, at different points in history. An autopsy revealed that he also had several kidney and bladder stones, a probable cause of the abdominal pains he suffered from later in life. He was placed in a wooden shrine, his body was then covered with his priestly garments. On 1 August the shrine was then buried in the small Maria della Strada Church. In 1568 that church was pulled down and replaced with the Church of the Gesù. Saint Ignatius was put into a new coffin and reinterred in the new church.

St. Ignatius was beatified in 1609, and then canonized, receiving the title of Saint on 12 March 1622. His feast day is celebrated on 31 July.

He is the patron saint of the Basque provinces of Gipuzkoa and Biscay as well as the Society of Jesus and was declared patron saint of all spiritual retreats by Pope Pius XI in 1922. Ignatius is also a foremost patron saint of soldiers.

FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

FROM THE VATICAN II DIARIES OF REV. MSGR. JOSEPH CLIFFORD FENTON

Perhaps some of you have heard of Msgr. Fenton, as he was one of America's exemplary theologians. This is a partial list of his many works:

- "The Theology of Prayer" (1939)
- "Laying the Foundation" (original title: "We Stand With Christ," 1943)
- "The Church of Christ" (Collection of Theological Articles, 1944-59)
- "The Catholic Church and Salvation" (1958)

Msgr. Fenton who was present during the entirety of Vatican II said most famously that the Council was "The End of the Catholic Religion as we have known it."

"He distinguished himself as a gifted, competent, and orthodox Catholic theologian entirely loyal to the Magisterium of the Church. Over the years, Fenton battled many Modernist errors and engaged in heated polemics with their proponents. In particular, he forcefully refuted the error of religious liberty promoted by Jesuit Fr. John Courtney Murray, WHICH LATER BECAME NOVUS ORDO DOCTRINE." [Novus Ordo Watch, July 7, 2017]

Much more could be said about Msgr. Fenton but suffice it to say that he was "one of the good guys." When the Church is once again restored, he just might be considered a candidate for Sainthood. Here I present some statements taken from his diaries:

"If I did not believe in God, I would believe that the Catholic Church was about to end." (Nov. 23, 1962)

"To me the condition here in Rome is evidence of the existence of the Church as a miracle of the social order. In general, it is being run by men who have no concern whatsoever for the purity or the integrity of Catholic doctrine. And yet, when the chips are down, the doctrine of Christ always comes through." (Nov. 5, 1960)

"I had always thought the Council was dangerous. It was started for no sufficient reason. There was too much talk about what it was supposed to accomplish. Now I am afraid that real trouble is on the way." (Oct 13, 1962)

"As far as I can see the Church is going to be very badly hurt by this council. The opposition between the liberals and loyal Catholics has been brought out into the open..." (Oct 27, 1962)

"The sense or feeling of this gathering seems to be entirely liberal. I am anxious to get home. I am afraid there is nothing at all that I can do here. Being in the council is, of course, the great experience...but at the same time, it has been a frightful disappointment. I never thought the episcopate was so liberal..." (Oct 31, 1962)

"...it is nonsense and a disgrace to think that John XXIII is 'deceived' or 'mal servite.' He is the boss." (Nov. 25, 1962)


