## St. Luke The Evangelist

**GOSPEL Luke 10:1-9** At that time, the Lord appointed seventy-two others, and sent them forth two and two before Him into every town and place where He Himself was to come. And He said to them: "The harvest indeed is great, but the laborers are few. Pray therefore the Lord of the harvest to send forth laborers into His harvest. Go: Behold I send you as lambs among wolves. Carry neither purse, nor wallet, nor sandals, and greet no one on the way. Into whatever house you enter, first say: 'Peace be to this house.' And if a son of peace be there, your peace shall rest upon him: but if not, it shall return to you. And in the same house, remain, eating and drinking such things as they have: for the laborer is worthy of his hire. Do not go from house to house. And whatever town you enter, and they receive you, eat such things as are set before you. And heal the sick that are therein and say to them: 'The kingdom of God is at hand for you.' "

### Saint John Cantius, Confessor



(23 June 1390 – 24 December 1473) was a Polish priest, scholastic philosopher, physicist and theologian. He was born in Kęty, a small town in Poland. He attended the Kraków Academy at which he attained a bachelor degree. In 1418 he became a Doctor of Philosophy. Upon graduation he spent the next three years conducting philosophy classes at the university, while preparing for the priesthood.

Upon his ordination, he became rector at the school of the Canons Regular of the Most Holy Sepulcher in Miechow. While there, he was offered a professorship of Sacrae Scripturae (Sacred Scripture) back at his alma mater. He attained a doctorate in theology and eventually became director of the theology department. St. John held the professorship until his death in 1473.

He spent many hours copying manuscripts of the Holy Scriptures, theological tracts, and other scholarly works. He became well known in the city for his generosity and compassion toward the poor, especially needy students at the university. St. John subsisted on what was strictly necessary to sustain his life, giving alms regularly to the poor. He made one pilgrimage to Jerusalem and four pilgrimages on foot to Rome.

John Cantius was beatified in Rome by Pope Clement X on 28 March 1676. He was named patron of Poland and Lithuania by Pope Clement XII in the year 1737. Ninety-one years after his beatification, Blessed John Cantius was canonized on 16 July 1767, by Pope Clement XIII.

The Roman Breviary distinguishes him with three hymns; he is the only confessor not a bishop who has been given this honor in the Roman Catholic liturgy.

St. John Cantius is a popular saint in Poland. A number of churches and schools founded by Polish communities throughout North America are named in his honor. St. John Cantius's feast day was inserted into the General Roman Calendar in 1770, it is assigned to October 20th.

**GOSPEL for the 20<sup>th</sup> Sunday after Pentecost** ~ (St. John 4:46-53) At that time, there was a certain ruler, whose son was sick at Capharnaum. When he heard that Jesus had come from Judea into Galilee, he sent to Him and prayed Him to come down and heal his son: for he was at the point of death.

Jesus therefore said to him: "Unless you see signs and wonders, you believe not." The ruler said to him: "Lord, come down before my son dies." Jesus saith to him: "Go thy way. Thy son lives."

The man believed the word which Jesus said to him and went his way. And as he was going down, his servants met him: and they brought word, saying, that his son lived. He asked therefore of them the hour wherein he grew better. And they said to him: "Yesterday at the seventh hour, the fever left him." The father therefore knew that it was at the same hour that Jesus said to him: "Thy son lives." And himself believed, and his whole house.



*Gospel Commentary ~*



God permitted the son of the ruler to fall sick, that he, being thereby led to seek assistance from Christ, might obtain faith and salvation. In like manner, in order to convert sinners, He often permits manifold evils and misfortunes to come upon them, either in their own persons, or in their children, or their goods.

If God sends upon us tribulations, floods, hail, famine, war, sickness or death of those we love, He thereby seeks nothing else than to move us at least to abandon sin and to turn to Him. God, indeed, sometimes sends afflictions upon the pious and innocent, or allows them to be troubled and tormented by misfortune, but He does this only to try their patience and love for Him; to detach them from the world; to set them on their guard against sin; and to give them opportunity for gaining the greatest merits; for "to them that love God, all things work together unto good" (Rom. viii. 28).

The father of a family, by example, can accomplish a great good! Hardly had this ruler received the faith, when his whole household was converted and believed in Jesus Christ. Thus fathers and mothers of families, by their good example, their piety, their zeal in prayer, their frequent receiving of the holy sacraments, by their meekness, their moderation, their modesty, may do incalculable good to their dependents and the members of their houses. Would that they might reflect on this! "For if they have no care for their own, and especially those of their own house, they have denied the faith and are worse than the infidel" (I. Tim. v. 8).
