Twenty Second Sunday After Pentecost

GOSPEL Matt. 22:15-21

At that time, the Pharisees went and took counsel how they might ensnare Him in His talk. And they send to Him their disciples, with the Herodians, saying, "Master, we know that Thou art true, and teachest the way of God in truth, and carest not for anyone: for Thou regardest not the person of men. Tell us therefore, What thinkest Thou? Is it lawful to give tribute unto Caesar, or not?" But Jesus perceived their wickedness, and said, "Why tempt ye Me, ye hypocrites? Show Me the tribute money." And they brought unto Him a penny. And He saith unto them, "Whose is this image and superscription?" They saith unto Him, "Caesar's." Then saith He unto them, "Render therefore unto Caesar the things that are Caesar's; and unto God the things that are God's."



St. Frances Xavier Cabrini was born as Maria Francesca Cabrini on July 15, 1850 in Lombardy, Italy. She was born two months premature and the youngest of thirteen children. Frances would live most of her life in a fragile and delicate state of health. She dedicated her life to religious work from a young age and received a convent education at a school ran by the Daughters of the Sacred Heart. She graduated with high honors and a teaching certificate.

When Frances was 18, she applied for admission to the religious congregation of the Daughters of the Sacred Heart, but was turned down because of her poor health. Instead, a priest asked her to teach at the House of Providence Orphanage. In 1877, she became Mother Cabrini after she finally made her vows and took the religious habit, also adding Xavier to her name in honor of St. Francis Xavier.

When the House of Providence Orphanage closed, her bishop asked her to found the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart to care for the poor children in both schools and hospitals. In its first five years, the institute established seven homes and a free school and nursery. Frances wanted to continue her mission in China, but Pope Leo XIII urged her to go to the United States, a nation that was becoming flooded with Italian immigrants who needed her help.

On March 31, 1889, Frances arrived in New York City. Right from the beginning she encountered many disappointments and hardships. The house originally intended for her new orphanage was no longer available. Archbishop Michael Corrigan found them housing with the convent of the Sisters of Charity. Frances then received permission to found an orphanage in what is now West Park, New York and now known as Saint Cabrini Home.

Filled with a deep trust in God and endowed with a wonderful administrative ability, Frances founded 67 institutions, including orphanages, schools, and hospitals, within 35 years dedicated to caring for the poor, uneducated, sick, abandoned, and especially for the Italian immigrants. Her institutions were spread out in places all over the United States, including New York, Colorado, and Illinois.

In 1909, Frances became a naturalized citizen of the United States. Eight years later, on December 22, 1917, Frances passed at the age of 67, at the Columbus Hospital, one of her own hospitals, in Chicago, Illinois.

Frances' body was originally placed at the Saint Cabrini Home but was exhumed in 1931 as part of her canonization process. St. Frances Xavier Cabrini was beatified on November 13, 1938, by Pope Pius XI and canonized by Pope Pius XII on July 7, 1946, making her the first United States citizen to be canonized. Her feast day is celebrated on November 13th.



This year marks the 25th anniversary of Holy Family Chapel at its present location and its 38th year of service to traditional Catholics in this area. Thanks be to God, the Chapel has enjoyed a blessed and prosperous existence for nearly 4 decades. In order to preserve and grow the Catholic faith, given the challenges of the times we live in, we must plan for

the next 25 years to come. Toward that end, the Board of Directors of Holy Family Chapel would like to begin gathering information and ideas in anticipation of creating an elementary school for the chapel.



The Board believes that the continued existence and growth of this chapel will require a vision of the future that includes a church school. It will take much time and effort for an undertaking of this magnitude, but to ensure the continuation of the Catholic Faith in this area, we must provide our youth a solid Catholic education and a place of stability for future generations to come.

God willing, we will be able to extend our reach and spread the True Faith through the system used most effectively in our wonderful country, the Catholic Parish School. During this phase of planning, we are soliciting the ideas and assistance of all parish members. **A meeting to discuss this topic will be held in the parish hall on Wednesday, November 20, 2019 from 6:30 to 7:30 pm.** We encourage all those interested in participating to attend this first meeting. Follow-on meetings will be scheduled as needed.

FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

Sacred Scripture in various places makes clear its teaching concerning many things. For instance, Christ's admonition against the sin of adultery is transparent, no one with any honesty can fail to see that for what it is, and everyone knows it. There are, however, many passages and texts from the Bible that are simply not quite as evident, and some are downright mystifying. An area of specific consideration is those matters of Eschatology—that area of theology having to do with the "last things."

In the Old Testament, the Prophet Daniel says the following concerning the End Times:

But thou, O Daniel, shut up the words, and seal the book, even to the time appointed: many shall pass over, and knowledge shall be manifold. (12:4) DRV

It is interesting to note that some translations render the passage this way: "many shall fall away, and evil shall be manifold."

But the concept God wants us to know as we come more and more into the final age is that some of what Sacred Scripture teaches will become more apparent as events manifest themselves. This is indicated by the phrase "shut up the words, and seal the book." Because at that time "many shall pass over, and knowledge shall be manifold." This cannot but be an allusion to transportation such as cars, planes and trains—things that were not known of in previous ages. Furthermore, knowledge is increased like never before with the advent of computers and the internet. Therefore with the coming of these things, some will understand events under the charism of Bible prophecy that were not understood before.

On June 29, 1972 Paul VI in a famous passage said:

After the Second Vatican Council there has come a day of clouds and storms, and of darkness...and how did this come about? ... There has been a power, an adversary power, let us call him by his name: The Devil...it is as if from some mysterious crack, no it is not mysterious, **from some crack the smoke of Satan has entered the temple of God.**

There is a particularly striking passage in the Apocalypse [9:1-3] that could easily apply in understanding the statement of Paul VI above:

And the fifth angel sounded the trumpet, and I saw a star fall from heaven upon the earth, and there was given to him the KEY of the bottomless pit: and he opened the bottomless pit: and the smoke of the pit arose, as the smoke of a great furnace; and the sun and the air were darkened with the smoke of the pit and there came out locusts upon the earth. And power was given to them, as scorpions of the earth have power.

We will analyze this next week.

DRESS POLICY




