Matt. 24, 15-35

At that time, Jesus said to His disciples, When therefore you shall see the abomination of desolation, which was spoken of by Daniel the prophet, standing in the holy place: he that readeth let him understand. Then they that are in Judea, let them flee to the mountains: And he that is on the housetop, let him not come down to take any thing out of his house: And he that is in the field, let him not go back to take his coat. And woe to them that are with child, and that give suck in those days. But pray that your flight be not in the winter, or on the sabbath. For there shall be then great tribulation, such as hath not been from the beginning of the world until now, neither shall be. And unless those days had been shortened, no flesh should be saved: but for the sake of the elect those days shall be shortened. Then if any man shall say to you: Lo here is Christ, or there, do not believe him. For there shall arise false Christs and false prophets, and shall show great signs and wonders, insomuch as to deceive (if possible) even the elect. Behold I have told it to you, beforehand. If therefore they shall say to you: Behold he is in the desert, go ye not out: Behold he is in the closets, believe it not. For as lightning cometh out of the east, and appeareth even into the west: so shall the coming of the Son of man be. Wheresoever the body shall be, there shall the eagles also be gathered together. And immediately after the tribulation of those days, the sun shall be darkened and the moon shall not give her light, and the stars shall fall from heaven, and the powers of heaven shall be moved: And then shall appear the sign of the Son of man in heaven: and then shall all tribes of the earth mourn: and they shall see the Son of man coming in the clouds of heaven with much power and majesty. And he shall send his angels with a trumpet, and a great voice: and they shall gather together his elect from the four winds, from the farthest parts of the heavens to the utmost bounds of them. And from the fig tree learn a parable: When the branch thereof is now tender, and the leaves come forth, you know that summer is nigh. So you also, when you shall see all these things, know ye that it is nigh, even at the doors. Amen I say to you, that this generation shall not pass, till all these things be done. Heaven and earth shall pass, but my words shall not pass.

IT'S NOT JUST THE TURKEY

Perhaps no other custom so clearly reveals this nation's original character as that of Thanksgiving Day. America was the first to nationally recognize its dependence on God with a special day set aside to thank Him for all His many blessings. While the exact date of the first American Thanksgiving observance is debatable, there is no doubt this custom sprang from the shared Christian heritage of those early pilgrims. From early Spanish expeditions in the late 1500's to the Popham Colony in Maine in 1607, each group publicly declared their thanks to the God of the Bible. Twelve years later, settlers in Virginia declared a day of thanksgiving for their survival on the shores of this then unchartered land. And in 1623, Governor William Bradford of Plymouth Colony established the most famous of all such observances when a bountiful harvest prompted him to proclaim a special day to "render thanksgiving to ye Almighty God for all His blessings." During the War of Independence from England, the U.S. Continental Congress set aside a day for thanksgiving and praise for the decisive victory at Saratoga in 1777, marking the first time that all American colonies took part in such an event on the same day. The following year at Valley Forge, George Washington declared a special day of thanksgiving upon receiving news that France would provide aid to our cause. And later, as the young nation's first president, he responded to a congressional petition by declaring Thursday, November 26, 1789, as the first Thanksgiving Day of the United States of America.


But it was the tireless crusade of Sarah Josepha Hale that finally led to the establishment of this beautiful observance as a national American holiday. Her moving letters so touched the heart of Abraham Lincoln that in 1863 – in the midst of the horrors of the Civil War – he urged his countrymen to be mindful of their many blessings, that they are "the gracious gifts of the Most High God" who ought to be thanked "with one heart and one voice, by the whole American People." Of course, giving thanks to God is certainly not an exclusive American convention – it was first commanded of Christian believers many thousands of years before. Paul wrote, "In all things give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you" (1 Thessalonians 5:18). Notice that the charge was not to give thanks for everything – rather, we are to give thanks in all things. Good or bad, right or wrong, be thankful in everything! Our American forebears knew this well. So in this season of Thanksgiving, Holy Family invites all to again take part in this beautiful tradition rooted in the biblical heritage of Scripture. Holy Family is thankful to God for all His many blessings upon our Chapel and for His faithful supply through believers like you who support the Church. Above all, we are thankful for Christ, "who having joy set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and now sitteth on the right hand of the throne of God" (Hebrews 12:2). Now that is something to be truly thankful for!

Saint Andrew NOVEMBER 30

The first Apostle. Fisherman by trade. Brother of Simon Peter. Follower of John the Baptist. Little else is said about him in the Gospels. Andrew went through life leading people to Jesus, both before and after the Crucifixion. Missionary in Asia Minor and Greece, and possibly areas in modern Russia and Poland. Martyred on an saltire (x-shaped) cross, he is said to have preached for two days from it.

There are several explanations for why Andrew became the patron of Scotland.

- In 345, Emperor Constantine the Great decided to translate Andrew's bones from Patras, Greece to Constantinople. Saint Regulus of Scotland was instructed by an angel to take many of these relics to the far northwest. He was eventually told to stop on the Fife coast of Scotland, where he founded the settlement of Saint Andrew.
- In the 7th century, Saint Wilfrid of York brought some of the saint's relics with him after a pilgrimage to Rome, Italy. The Scots king, Angus MacFergus, installed them at Saint Andrew's to enhance the prestige of the new diocese.
- When the Pictish King Angus faced a large invading army, he prayed for guidance. A white cloud in the form of a saltire cross floated across the blue sky above him. Angus won a decisive victory, and decreed that Andrew would be the patron saint of his country. Following Robert Bruce's victory at the *Battle of Bannockburn* in 1314, the *Declaration of Arbroath* officially named Saint Andrew the patron saint of Scotland. The Saltire became the national flag of Scotland in 1385.
- On the lighter side.....St Andrews, Scotland is also known worldwide as the "home of golf". This is in part because The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews, founded in 1754, which until 2004 exercised legislative authority over the game worldwide (except in the United States and Mexico). It is also because the famous St Andrews Links (acquired by the town in 1894) are the most frequent venue for The Open Championship, the oldest of golf's four major championships. Visitors travel to St Andrews in great numbers for several courses ranked amongst the finest in the world, as well as for the sandy beaches.


