

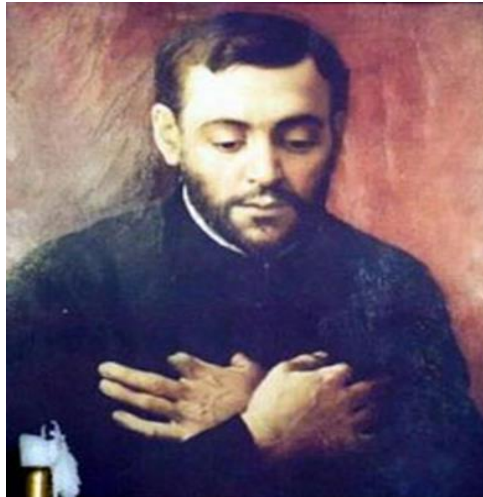

GOSPEL Luke 6:17-23 At that time, Jesus coming down with them, He stood in a plain place: and the company of His disciples and a very great multitude of people from all Judea and Jerusalem and the sea coast, both of Tyre and Sidon, who came to listen to Him and to be healed of their diseases. And they that were troubled with unclean spirits were cured. And all the multitude sought to touch Him: for virtue went out from Him and healed all. And He, lifting up His eyes on His disciples, said: "Blessed are ye poor: for yours is the kingdom of God. Blessed are ye that hunger now: for you shall be filled. Blessed are ye that weep now: for you shall laugh. Blessed shall you be when men shall hate you, and when they shall separate you and shall reproach you and cast out your name as evil, because of the Son of Man. Be glad in that day and rejoice: for behold, your reward is great in heaven.



OCTOBER, MONTH OF THE HOLY ANGELS AND THE ROSARY

The lovely month of October comes round and directs our attention and meditations to the rosary and the holy angels. The Blessed Virgin Mary is the Queen of Angels. The mysteries of the rosary are almost constantly suggestive of the angels. The announcement that she should be the mother of Jesus was made to Mary by an angel. No doubt the visitation to her cousin Elizabeth was attended by angels, though they were invisible. The birth of the Savior was announced by a glorious choir of angels, who sang, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to men of good will."

The agony of our Lord in the garden was consoled by a ministering angel. In the glorious mysteries, especially, the ministry of the angels is conspicuous. At the resurrection angels came and rolled away the stone from the sepulcher and announced to the disciples that their Lord had risen from the dead. At the ascension a company of angels received Him as He passed out of sight. The assumption and coronation of the Blessed Virgin were, of course, celebrated by an innumerable company of angels. Indeed, if we meditate at all on these interesting mysteries as we recite the various decades, it would seem the most natural thing in the world to include offices of these glorious messengers of God who are sent forth to minister to those who shall be heirs of salvation.

In 1917, Jesus sent His Mother to Fatima, Portugal on the 13th day of consecutive months with pleas and warnings of what might happen if man did not turn back to God. These events culminated on October 13th with one of the greatest documented miracles of modern times that was witnessed by literally tens of thousands of people. Our Blessed Mother's message was quite simple. Put Jesus back at the center of our lives. Ask for God's mercy. Make sacrifices and reparations for the ways man has offended God. And pray the rosary for peace!

Most importantly, our Blessed Mother brought us a message of HOPE! If we listen, and do these things, our merciful God stands ready to embrace us. GOSPEL for the Eighteenth Sunday After Pentecost (Matt. 9:1-8) At that time, Jesus entering into a boat, passed over the water and came into His own city.



And behold they brought to Him one sick of the palsy lying in a bed. And Jesus, seeing their faith, said to the man sick of the palsy: "Be of good heart, son, thy sins are forgiven thee." And behold some of the scribes said within themselves: "He blasphemeth." And Jesus seeing their thoughts, said: "Why do you think evil in your hearts? Whether is easier, to say, Thy sins are forgiven thee: or to say, Arise, and walk? But that you may know that the Son of man hath power on earth to forgive sins," (then said He to the man sick of the palsy,) "Arise, take up thy bed, and go into thy house." And he arose and went into his house. And the multitude seeing it, feared, and glorified God that gave such power to men.



St. Isaac Jogues, S.J. (10 January 1607 – 18 October 1646) was a French missionary and martyr who traveled and worked among the Iroquois, Huron, and other Native populations in North America.

He was the first European to name Lake George, calling it Lac du Saint Sacrement (Lake of the Blessed Sacrament).

In 1646, Jogues was martyred by the Mohawk at their village of Ossernenon, north of the Mohawk River.

Jogues, Jean de Brébeuf and six other martyred missionaries, all Jesuit priests or laypeople associated with them, were canonized by the Catholic Church in 1930. They are known as the Canadian Martyrs, or the North American Martyrs. A shrine was built in their honor at Auriesville, New York, formerly believed to be that of the Mohawk village. Their feast day is celebrated on 26 September.
