Fifth Sunday After Pentecost

GOSPEL Matt. 5:20-24 At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: "Unless your justice abound more than that of the scribes and Pharisees, you shall not enter into the kingdom of heaven. You have heard that it was said to them of old: 'Thou shalt not kill.' And whosoever shall kill, shall be in danger of the judgment. But I say to you, that whosoever is angry with his brother, shall be in danger of the judgment. And whosoever shall say to his brother, 'Raca,' shall be in danger of the council. And whosoever shall say, 'Thou fool', shall be in danger of hell fire. If therefore thou offer thy gift at the altar, and there thou remember that thy brother hath anything against thee; Leave there thy offering before the altar, and go first to be reconciled to thy brother, and then coming thou shalt offer thy gift."



Saint Anne, Mother of the Blessed Virgin Mary (ca. 3 B.C.) was chosen by God to be the mother of Mary, His own Blessed Mother on earth and was the spouse of Saint Joachim. Ancestor of the Eternal King and High Priest, Joachim was of the royal house of David, while Anne was of Levitical descent. Their lives were wholly occupied with prayer and good works. One thing only was wanting to their union — they were childless, and this was held as a bitter misfortune among the Jews. At length, when Anne was well advanced in age, Mary was born, the fruit rather of grace than of nature, and the child more of God than of man.

With the birth of Mary, the holy matron began a new life; she watched Her every movement with reverent tenderness, and, aware of the little one's destiny, felt herself hourly sanctified by the presence of her Immaculate Child. But she had vowed her daughter to God; to God the child Mary had already consecrated Herself, and to Him Anne gave Her back. Mary was three years old when Anne and Joachim led Her to the Temple steps, saw Her pass by Herself into the inner sanctuary, and then saw Her no more. Thus, was Anne left childless in her old age, and deprived of her purest earthly joy. The holiest parents on earth could not, in the plan of God, raise this Child as was needed: Mary had to suffer from Her earliest years. Saint Anne and Saint Joachim humbly adored the Divine Will, and continued to watch and pray, until God called them to unending rest.

France and Canada possess the principal sanctuaries of Saint Anne: in France, at Apt in Provence, and at Auray in Brittany; in Canada at Sainte-Anne-de-Beaupré in the Province of Quebec. At Apt the discovery in 792 of Saint Anne's relics, brought by Lazarus and his two sisters to France, was wholly miraculous, authenticated by the presence of Charlemagne during the discovery, and the signature of Pope Adrian I on the written account of the facts.

She is patroness of housewives, women in labor, cabinetmakers, and miners. Her emblem is a door. St. Anne has been frequently represented in art, and the lovely face depicted by Leonardo da Vinci comes first to mind in this connection. The name Anne derives from the Hebrew Hannah, meaning "grace." Her Celebrated Feast Day is July 26th.

Reflection: *Saint Anne is glorious among the Saints, not only as the mother of Mary, but because she gave Mary to God. Learn from her to reverence a religious vocation as the highest privilege, and to sacrifice every natural bond, however holy, at the call of God.*

Prayer to St. Anne ~ *O God, You bestowed on St. Anne such grace that she was found worthy to become the mother of Mary, who brought forth Your only begotten Son. Grant that we may be helped by her intercession. Good St. Anne, mother of Her who is our Life, our Sweetness and our Hope, pray to her for us, and obtain our request. (3 times)*

FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

VATICAN II AND THE NEW RELIGION

“Vatican II was a sinister farce acted out by three thousand good-for-nothings, some of whom, despite the gold pectoral crosses on their chests, don't even believe in the Trinity or the Virgin!”
(Bishop Antonio Romeo of the Sacred Congregation of Rites, November 27, 1964)

The “three thousand good-for-nothings” of whom Bishop Romeo speaks, are, of course, the so-called Catholic bishops at the time of the “Second” Vatican Council. As incomprehensible as it might seem, these men both individually and collectively betrayed the Church with a deluge of perfidy and manifest apostasy, totally unprecedented in Church history.

In Rama Coomaraswamy's wonderful book “The Destruction of the Christian Tradition,” Bishop Thomas Fouhy writes in his very astute Introduction:

Our Lord assured us that “a bad tree cannot bear good fruit.” This is the new establishment that came into existence with the illegal Second Vatican Council (1962-1965), a diabolical, hateful event culminating in worldwide apostasy. As a result, this new institution can no longer be called “The Catholic Church,” or “My Church” as Jesus called it...

The documents of Vatican II, which were not only revolutionary in nature, but purported to actually substantially change the nature of the Church as Christ founded it, paved the way for shocking and debilitating changes that have only gotten worse as the decades have moved forward. In point of fact, the changes that Vatican II, its “popes” and “hierarchy” mandated were strenuously warned against by true popes of prior times, and they have been vindicated in their prophetic utterances.

These changes were inspired by the horrific principles of Freemasonry and, of course, the phenomenon of “Modernism” as explicated and developed by Pope St. Pius X who with his encyclical “Pascendi Dominici Gregis,” attempted to alert the Church against this very real and insidious danger, but few listened — and apparently many were sympathetic to the enemies of Christ and their agenda.

So, what happened at the Council?


