GOSPEL Luke 19:41-47

The Story of the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary

The dogma of the Assumption of Mary - has its roots in the early centuries of the Church. The Catholic Church teaches that when Mary ended her earthly life, God assumed her, body and soul into heaven.

This belief traces its roots back to the earliest years of the Church. While a site outside of Jerusalem was recognized as the tomb of Mary, the earliest Christians maintained that "no one was there".

According to St. John of Damascus, in the 5th century, at the Council of Chalcedon in 451, Roman Emperor Marcian requested the body of Mary, Mother of God. St. Juvenal, who was Bishop of Jerusalem replied "that Mary died in the presence of all the Apostles, but that her tomb, when opened upon the request of St. Thomas, was found empty; wherefrom the Apostles concluded that the body was taken up to heaven," the saint recorded.

By the 8th century, around the time of Pope Adrian, the Church began to change its terminology, renaming the feast day of the Memorial of Mary to the Assumption of Mary.

The belief in the Assumption of Mary was a widely held tradition, and a frequent meditation in the writings of saints throughout the centuries. However, it was not defined officially until the past century. In 1950, Pope Pius XII made an infallible, ex-cathedra statement in the Apostolic Constitution *Munificentissimus Deus* officially defining the dogma of the Assumption.

"By the authority of our Lord Jesus Christ, of the Blessed Apostles Peter and Paul, and by our own authority, we pronounce, declare, and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma: that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory," the pope wrote.

Today, the Feast of the Assumption is marked as a major feast day and a public holiday in many countries. In most countries, including the United States, it is a Holy Day of Obligation.

FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

THE ANTICHRIST AND OUR TIMES I

When I was in second grade, Sister Emmanuel spoke to us about the Antichrist and his reign in a story something like this — I'm paraphrasing of course:

At some point in time unknown to us, Antichrist will suddenly appear on the world stage. He violently persecutes the Church; kills the Pope and many of the faithful, but God raises up a multitude of martyrs who die for the Faith of Christ. Antichrist is generally recognized as the "man of sin," and although the persecution he inflicts upon humanity is the worst in history it will last a very short time, perhaps only a month or two. At the end of this period, Jesus Christ will come in all power and glory to defeat the consummate evildoer, casting he and his followers once and for all into Hell. All of those who died during this horrible time, will rise from the dead and along with those still alive are brought into the Kingdom of God to live with Christ and His saints forever.

I remember at the time being totally fascinated by Sister's account but knew even then it was tailored for the mind of a child. We must, however, approach this topic as faithful and mature adults. It would be nice to think that Antichrist, in his person and activities would be obvious as the scenario depicted above, but such is not and will not be the case.

As St. Paul tells us:

And then the wicked one [Antichrist] will be revealed...his coming is according to the working of Satan **with all power and signs and lying wonders, and with all wicked deception to those who are perishing...**

Deception! — this is a major characteristic of the times of Antichrist! From the famous sermon of Fr. Frederick Faber for Pentecost Sunday in 1861:

We must remember that if all the manifestly good men were on one side and all the manifestly bad men on the other, there would be no danger of anyone, least of all the elect, being deceived by lying wonders. **It is the good men, good once, we must hope good still, who are to do the work of Antichrist and so sadly to crucify the Lord afresh... bear in mind this feature of the last days, that this deceitfulness arises from good men being on the wrong side.**

From the Publishers Preface of "The Reign of Antichrist," 1974, TAN BOOKS AND PUBLISHERS, by Thomas A. Nelson:

Needless to say, the doctrine of Antichrist is very much a part of [our] Catholic theology and Tradition, and as such, must be considered carefully by all men. The learned and unlearned alike, for the Antichrist, when he comes, will affect the lives of all men. Based upon the firmness of their faith and the correctness of their knowledge, men will either apostatize or remain faithful to Christ and His Church. Thus, it will be seen that a knowledge of the prophecies regarding Antichrist is of an immensely practical nature.

It must be emphasized that the study of Antichrist is indeed not only practical, but the salvation of our souls may depend upon it.


