

Seventeenth Sunday After Pentecost

GOSPEL Matt. 22, 34-46 At that time, the Pharisees, came to Jesus and one of them, a doctor of the Law, putting him to the test, asked Him, "Master, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" Jesus said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with your whole heart, and with your whole soul, and with your whole mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. And the second is like it, You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend the whole Law and the Prophets." Now while the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus questioned them saying, "What do you think of the Christ? Whose son is He?" They said to Him, "David's". He said to them, "How then does David in the Spirit call Him Lord", saying, "The Lord said to my Lord: Sit at My right hand, till I make Your enemies Your footstool?" If David, therefore, calls Him Lord, how is he his son?" And no one could answer Him a word; neither did anyone dare from that day forth to ask Him any more questions.

The Feast of the Most Holy Rosary, is a feast day of the Roman Catholic Church, celebrated on 7 October, the anniversary of the decisive victory of the combined fleet of the Holy League of 1571 over the Ottoman navy at the Battle of Lepanto.

In 1571, Pope St. Pius V organized a coalition of forces from Spain and smaller Christian kingdoms, republics and military orders, to rescue Christian outposts in Cyprus, particularly the Venetian outpost at Famagusta which, however, surrendered after a long siege on August 1 before the Christian forces set sail. On October 7, 1571, the Holy League, a coalition of southern European Catholic maritime states, sailed from Messina, Sicily, and met a powerful Ottoman fleet in the Battle of Lepanto. Knowing that the Christian forces were at a distinct materiel disadvantage, the holy pontiff, Pope Pius V, called for all of Europe to pray the Rosary for victory, and led a rosary procession in Rome.

Pius V instituted "Our Lady of Victory" as an annual feast to commemorate the victory at Lepanto, which he attributed to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

In 1573, Pope Gregory XIII changed the title of the "Feast of Our Lady of Victory" to "Feast of the Holy Rosary", to be celebrated on the first Sunday of October. Dominican friar Juan Lopez in his 1584 book on the rosary states that the feast of the rosary was offered "in memory and in perpetual gratitude of the miraculous victory that the Lord gave to his Christian people that day against the Turkish armada".

In 1671 the observance of this festival was extended by Clement X to the whole of Spain, and somewhat later Clement XI, after the victory over the Turks gained by Prince Eugene in the Battle of Petrovaradin on 5 August 1716 (the feast of Our Lady of the Snows), commanded the feast of the Rosary to be celebrated by the universal Church.

Leo XIII raised the feast to the rank of a double of the second class and added to the Litany of Loreto the invocation "Queen of the Most Holy Rosary". On this feast, in every church in which the Rosary confraternity has been duly erected, a plenary indulgence toties quoties is granted upon certain conditions to all who visit therein the Rosary chapel or statue of Our Lady. This has been called the "Portiuncula" of the Rosary.

Pius X in 1913 changed the date to 7 October, as part of his effort to restore celebration of the liturgy of the Sundays.

Catechism Classes - Reminder to parents that catechism classes are being held after the 9am Mass every Sunday.

Classes for preparation of First Communion are held in the church proper, first pew in front of the Sacred Heart statue.

Confirmation prep classes are held in the cry room at the back of the church and Apologetics classes are held on the outside patio on the NW side of the church hall or the Board Room (for video use).

It is the responsibility of all Catholic parents to provide Catholic teaching to their children. These classes are designed to assist with formal teaching of the church and preparation of these sacraments. Attendance is required and recorded for the reception of the sacrament of First Communion and Confirmation. The Apologetics classes are for all Confirmed young adults, and interested new converts, to help explain the faith in our challenging times. Please see James DeFillips for more information.

FATHER SAFREED'S REFLECTIONS

COGNITIVE DISSONANCE AND THE RECOGNIZE-AND-RESIST CROWD

“Cognitive dissonance” can be defined as: “the mental discomfort (psychological distress) experienced by a person who holds two or more contradictory beliefs, ideas, or values.” (Wikipedia)

As I have written before, there are three main groups who claim to bear the name “Traditionalist.” They are the (1) “indult” people who stay in the Novus Ordo church and simply want their “Latin Mass.” The primary outlet for this crowd is the Priestly Fraternity of St. Peter. Francis is their pope, and they believe, ostensibly, that the New Order church is the true Church of Jesus Christ. Then there is the (2) “Recognize & Resist” faction—they attempt to have “one foot in, and one foot out” of New church, if you will. In reality, of course, this can’t be done as a person is either in the Church or he is not. The Society of St. Pius X is the main vehicle for this group and remains the largest contingent of so-called Traditionalists presently. Then of course there are the much maligned (3) Sedevacantists, who understand that to accept Vatican II is to surrender to a defected, false Church. They realize that on basic, substantial issues, such as the nature of the Church itself — Vatican II teaches heresy, and therefore the church it created cannot be the Catholic Church.

Recognize & Resist seems to have an infinite number of bloggers on the internet. R&R has become the big theological train that most “conservative” and traditionally minded Catholics have climbed aboard. This is because, in a way, it is the most “comfortable” ride of the three, but a great price has come with it. In order to prop up Francis as pope and accept the Novus Ordo church as the same entity as it was before Vatican II, one must ignore, corrupt, dismiss and even malign pre-Conciliar teaching on these issues. Therefore, some of the more honest people in this group, because of the cognitive dissonance this approach engenders, have become Sedevacantists. One such blogger is Jonathan Byrd who recently posted on the blog “Traditional Catholic Priest,” an essay entitled, “ENDING COGNITIVE DISSONANCE.” I encourage you to find this post and read it in its entirety. Mr. Byrd is a layman “with a wife, 10 kids, 4 cats and a dog,” as his profile indicates. He writes in relation to the R&R bloggers:

WE HAVE DONE HARM TO THE FAITH... WE DID THE VERY THINGS THAT MODERNISTS HAVE DONE — NAMELY WE HAVE TWISTED WORDS TO SUIT NEW MEANINGS. IN FACT, WE HAVE LOST WHAT IT MEANS TO BE CATHOLIC BY EXPLAINING AWAY THE FAITH TO JUSTIFY HOW PEOPLE LIKE FRANCIS CAN ALL CALL THEMSELVES CATHOLIC [AND HOW HE COULD BE THE POPE] Mr. Byrd then says: “**Think about this for a moment.**”

The R&R position he says “Is extremely illogical and extremely not Catholic.” And: “The person that is the Pope must first be Catholic and if he isn’t Catholic then he isn’t the pope. **1+1=2...ain’t that hard to understand.**” The conclusion is very simple:

If you accept Francis is the pope then you must accept communion for adulterers, you must accept allowing communion for protestants, you must accept LGBT novelties, you must accept the novus ordo mass, the new rites, the “cult of man”.. etc. If the above is abhorrent to you...If you would rather die a thousand deaths than to give your consent to such abominable practices...Then welcome to Sedevacantism.

Personally, I offer congratulations to Mr. Byrd, who has taken this truly enlightened and courageous step. And rather than some who remain “crypto-sedevacantists” he has told the world about his conversion to the truth, and will be rewarded by the Lord Jesus Christ for his witness.
